Mellve A. Shahid, Sr. Founder/President, Board of Directors

Mellve A. Shahid, Sr., a 16-year prostate cancer survivor, is the Founder and Board President of The Empowerment Network, Inc. in St. Louis, MO. In March 2007, after having no sick days in his life, he was diagnosed with Stage 2 prostate cancer and given two years to live.

"On the operating table, I asked God to heal my body, restore my health and give me a second chance. I promised to fight prostate cancer and advocate for victims and survivors. I begged for my Life. All I want to do is keep my promise to God. I just want to be a helper and humble servant to those who need my help".

It was a pledge, a covenant, a divine oath. He believes in his vision and says he would give his life for this cause.

Shahid says God has answered his prayer.

Shahid developed The Empowerment Network (TEN) in February 2008 on his basement floor with his late Co-Founder, Isadore Wayne. Both being cancer survivors, they created what they could not find in their neighborhood...a source for information about prostate cancer. Within months, TEN grew to over one-hundred men.

His advocacy has led to thousands of men on a grassroots level being exposed to vital information about prostate health. The team sponsors prostate cancer walks, health fairs, and church tours where education and free PSA testing are provided.



State of Missouri Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, about one in eight men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime; and

WHEREAS, prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among American men behind lung cancer; and prostate cancer is the most common cancer diagnosis in American men, after skin cancer; and

WHEREAS, prostate cancer is a serious disease, but with appropriate treatment most men diagnosed with prostate cancer do not die from it; and

WHEREAS, improved awareness of prostate cancer, understanding risks for developing it, consultation with a medical provider, and access to recent medical advances that may extend patients' lives improve patient outcomes; and

WHEREAS, men should talk to their healthcare provider regarding their risk of developing prostate cancer and whether/when screening and related tests for early detection of prostate cancer are indicated; and this shared-decision making discussion can start at age fifty for men at average risk, or at age forty for men at higher risk, including African American men, men with a family history of prostate cancer, or men with a known genetic mutation that increases their risk for prostate cancer; and

WHEREAS, if a decision is made to screen for prostate cancer, a single blood test for prostate-specific antigen (PSA) is the most appropriate test for screening; and

WHEREAS, there is still more research to be done for prostate cancer so that new more effective treatments can be developed; and Missouri will continue to push for critical research and advance treatments for prostate cancer.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim September 2023, to be

PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

in Missouri and encourage the residents of Missouri to become informed and aware of prostate cancer.

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives hold in high esteem those Show-Me State organizations that are dedicated to improving quality of life in local communities and neighborhoods through improvement in health care; and

Whereas, The Empowerment Network, Incorporated, is celebrating Fifteen Years of Saving Lives during its Crystal Anniversary to be held on September 23, 2023, at the Orlando Gardens Event Center in St. Louis, Missouri; and

Whereas, The Empowerment Network is a St. Louis-based nonprofit, prostate cancer advocacy, education, and awareness organization with proceeds from their crystal anniversary gala event going towards programs that benefit prostate cancer survivors and their families; and

Whereas, approximately one in eight men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his life, making it the most common cancer diagnosis in American men after skin cancer, and the second leading cause of cancer death among American men behind lung cancer; and

Whereas, prostate cancer is a serious disease, but with appropriate treatment most men diagnosed with it will survive thanks to improved awareness that includes men understanding their risks for developing it, consultation with a medical provider, and access to recent medical advances, all of which may extend patients' lives and improve their outcomes; and

Whereas, men should talk to their healthcare provider regarding their risk of developing prostate cancer, and if a decision is made to screen for it, a single blood test for prostate-specific antigen (PSA) is the most appropriate test for screening in men age fifty who are at average risk, or at the age of forty for men at higher risk, including African American men, men with a family history of prostate cancer, or men with a known genetic mutation that increases their risk for the disease; and

Whereas, with more research to be done, the Show-Me State will continue to push for critical research that will undoubtedly develop new, more effective treatments for prostate cancer:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, One Hundred Second General Assembly, join to applaud the history, goals, and accomplishments associated with The Empowerment Network, Incorporated, and to convey to all of those involved this legislative body's most heartfelt best wishes as they celebrate their Crystal Anniversary on September 23, 2023; and
